
We carried out an audit of resources we currently have, and those we need, to support children who have little, or no English.

What are Language Ambassadors?


We are a group of children who represent different languages and cultures. There are currently about 16 different languages in our school. We use our skills and experiences to help newly arrived children and families settle into our school.



An Interview with Miss Tate



Q. How many years have you worked here?

A. Since 2001 – 5 years as a teacher, the rest as a teaching assistant.

Q. What are Language Ambassadors?

A. Language Ambassadors are a really enthusiastic group who want to provide support for newly arrived children and develop areas within school so every child feels safe and feels their language and culture are valued.

Q. What have you got planned for the language ambassadors?

A. The children will be supporting asylum seekers by handing out food parcels (provided by children and parents from school) at Justice First which is a charity that supports families who have been refused asylum in the UK.

Q. What do you like best about the language ambassadors?

A. I enjoy working with the children because they are 'true professionals' who show enthusiasm every session as well as provide great ideas when discussing how areas can be developed.
