## PE & Sports Premium Funding 2018-19

The Secretary of State lays down the following terms and conditions of the grant. The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils, in the 2018 to 2019 academic year, to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

## **Basis of Allocation**

Allocations for the academic year 2018 to 2019 are calculated using the number of pupils in years 1 to 6, as recorded in the January 2018 census, as follows:

- schools with 17 or more pupils receive £16,000 plus £10 per pupil
- schools with 16 or fewer pupils receive £1000 per pupil

Where a school's pupils are not recorded by year group, pupils aged 5 to 10 are deemed eligible.

Children from Reception to Y6 have had the opportunity to participate in a range of clubs including: Dance, multi-skills, gymnastics, cricket, cheerleading, tennis, rounders, dodgeball, netball, ball games and basketball.

There is a high level of participation and attendance for most children is good.

Younger children (Y2) say that they enjoy sports clubs because:

It gets them fit and gives them energy.

They like getting stronger.

It makes them healthy and they enjoy the games and activities they do.

They play fun games and helps them learn to dance so that when they are older they might be able to be in a show.

They like doing gymnastics routines.

Older children (Y5) said they enjoy the clubs because:

'Say you want to be an Olympian, or a professional sportsperson, it prepares you'

"It helps you to get better with throwing and it helps with the sports you want to do when you're older."

'It helps you move around, keeps you busy. Some people just go home and sit around but clubs help you move.'

'It helps you practise to be a professional'.

'Helps you bond with others.'

Older children have an opportunity to develop their sports leadership skills during clubs, by supporting younger or less confident children.

Children only miss P.E. because of injury; never because they have forgotten their kit.

Every child has suitable kit which fits them.

## Children say:

'Having P.E. kit from school is good because you can never forget things. Getting things together for school can put your parents and you under stress.'

25 / 27 Y5 children participated in a 3 day visit to an Outdoor Education facility. This was made affordable so that money was not a barrier to children attending if they wanted to.

When talking about the impact of their visit, children said:

If you are scared of something and you really want to try new stuff; we managed to be brave. I have learned not to be scared.

I overcame some of my fears, like my fear of heights on the zipline.

We spent three days without devices – we know now you can live without them. It shows there is more out there to do, not just being on devices.

You learn that you can do stuff when you didn't know you could.

When I went on the giant swing, I didn't want to go that high but I still pushed myself to go higher than I expected to go.

You got confidence from working together in groups – you are not just going to be that quiet one at the back.

When we went caving we had to communicate between ourselves so learnt how to work as a team. This was part of the puzzles activity too.

Children from Reception, Y2, and Y3-6 have taken part in a range of competitions and activities as follows:

Multi-sports festival for Reception

Cross country, football and basketball, hula hooping, netball, Air Trail, sports workshop for less active children, racquet skills, tennis, cricket, athletics, active sports festival, orienteering

Children talk very positively about being part of competitions.

They talk about seeing friends they know out of school during competitions and the way that they 'were cheering each other on and encouraging each other.'

One child stated 'If you feel a bit lonely, or unappreciated, if you have done well and got a medal, you feel appreciated by your family.'

They talk about how competitions 'push you to your limit because you are competing against others that you don't know. You get used to competing with faster children. It gets you more confident, makes your muscles stronger.'

Children chosen to attend a games day for less confident learners said:

'It was really fun. It's good so that you can keep fit and have more energy. It gives you energy and confidence.'

I thought I couldn't kick the ball in the net but I did it.

I did dodgeball and it was fun. I was better than I thought I would be.

We played duck, duck, goose and it was exciting.

I thought I couldn't put the ball into a hoop because my aim is bad – but I did it. So now I feel more confident about my aim.

We learned some new games so we can play them on the field.

Children participate well in a range of activities led by coaches. They respond well to the structure of the games and respond well to the adults; as they already have a positive relationship with them through P.E. lessons.

Staff have had the opportunity to broaden their subject knowledge, for example, teaching specific skills through a wider range of games.

Staff have commented that they feel more confident and have a wider range of strategies and ideas for teaching P.E, for example:

- I've developed my knowledge of how to teach dance which has always been an area I felt less confident in.
- I have learned how to use spots in gymnastics to mark the position of hands and legs.
- Improved my knowledge of differentiation in lessons.
- Better understanding of how to keep all children active during a session, e.g. a strategy for keeping everyone active in rounders.

Most children do not have regular opportunities to go swimming and for many, school swimming lessons are their first experience of swimming. After they have been swimming with school, several children have then had a chance to go with their family.
