Sir Michael Palin





Michael Palin was born on May 5, 1943 in Ranmoor, Sheffield, Yorkshire, England. He is most famous for his world-renowned travel series' such as 'Around the world in 80 Days' and 'The Himalayas'. He was awarded the CBE (Commander of the Order of the British Empire) in the 2000 Queen's Millennium honours list for his services to television and travel documentaries. His latest service to Geography was his appointment to the President if the Royal Geographic Society in London (2009-2012).

Mother Teresa





Mother Teresa was born Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu on 27 August 1910 in Macedonia. Mother Teresa taught geography at covenant schools in Kolkata, India before she founded the

Missionaries of Charity. Most notably she was awarded a Nobel Peace Prize in 1979 and the Nehru Prize for Promotion of International Peace & Understanding. On her death she was given the honour of a state funeral by the Government of India for her services to the poor.

Sir David Attenborough





Sir David Attenborourgh was born on the 8th May 1926. He is a renowned naturalist, traveller, explorer and all round environmentalist. He has helped to advocate and raise support for conservation efforts of animals and landscape across the globe. He was awarded a knighthood for his services to conservation.

Ibn Battuta



Ibn Battuta was born in Morocco on the 25th February 1304. He was a medieval Muslim traveller and scholar, who is widely recognized as one of the greatest travellers of all time. He is known for his extensive travels over a 30 year period through the Islamic Empires.
